LTA Releases **Competition** Plan 2025-29



LTA Update: A new LTA Competition Plan has been published for 2025-2029, which marks a key step change It's about ensuring that all players in the way we approach growing and developing the competitive structure in Great Britain.

The LTA want to work with all those involved in delivering competition activity to embed a true culture of competition across tennis and padel in Great Britain, to ultimately grow the numbers of adults and children competing, and as a result playing more and staying in the sport for longer.

A culture of competition promotes a belief amongst the tennis and

padel community in the value and importance of competitive play. regardless of age or ability - can access appropriate competitions for their level that are welcoming, enjoyable and inspiring.

Many people are successfully doing this already but there is more that can be done to address the gaps and encourage juniors to move from recreational to formal competition and to link coaching programmes to children's first experience of competition.

COUNTY UPDATES

Inclusive Tennis and Padel

We are working with the LTA to have a combined **PAN Disability festival** in the county later in the year, joining forces with potential players from Surrey, Middlesex & Oxfordshire. This festival will highlight wheelchair tennis and Para standing tennis and bring together other areas of disability so players can try our sport.

Wheelchair tennis sessions continue at both Bisham and at Reading University TennisPark and Sport in Mind continue to deliver free tennis once a week for their service users.

We held a very successful **SEND schools event** in Slough having trained 12 teachers earlier in the year. Those teachers delivered tennis during the summer term and then joined together for the festival at Eton College - 51 pupils attended. Many thanks to Laura Brookstein for all her organizational help pulling this together.

Both **Pangbourne Tennis Club** and **Sonning Tennis Club** delivered sessions at local primary schools for children with learning difficulties under our Open Court programme - please get in touch if this is something your club would be interested in delivering.

Our Workforce Development partner, Courtside Education (formerly Growing the Game) organized a very successful Inclusive **Padel coaches course** at **Maidenhead Padel** with 6 women and a wheelchair player taking part. A Padel Officials course will be on offer soon as well as a Tennis competition organisers course.

The **Berkshire Tennis Women's Network** have held a couple of gatherings in recent months - an in-person one in March to celebrate International Women's Day and online catch up in July. The group is made up of female coaches, officials, volunteers, committee members - anyone involved in tennis in the county. Anyone is welcome to join, with the purpose of sharing ideas, connecting and supporting each other to help grow women and girls tennis across the county.

8U County Open Days 2025

The Berkshire Tennis 8U County coaches will once again be holding Open Days for players who are keen to progress along their journey in tennis and be part of county training.

The emphasis of the sessions is tennis fun, parent education and informal assessment led by our 8U County Captain, Rob Flynn and 10U Performance Lead, Nigel Mann:

 Players should be born in 2018 (regularly competing), 2019, 2020 or 2021 (intending/starting to compete in internal/external competitions) Players should be playing/ Training at least twice a week (or looking to increase their training)

 Players should be passionate about tennis!

PADEL UPDATE

Padel continues to grow rapidly across the UK, and Berkshire is quickly becoming a key part of that growth. As of today, there are nine padel venues across the county, with additional sites scheduled to open by the end of the year and into early 2026.

With this expansion, we will need **more referees, officials and coaches** to support the sport's development and ensure events run smoothly. In 2024, we launched the first **Berkshire County Padel Championships** and subsequently formed our county's official padel teams (Men's, Ladies and Mixed). These teams made their competitive debut at the UK Padel County Championships in November 2024, competing against some of the strongest counties across the UK. Since then, we have competed in the O40, O50 UK Padel County Championships with remarkable results, considering our teams only began competing 6–7 months ago. Our next debut will be the O60 in September 2025, followed by a return to the UK Padel County Championships in November 2025.

Earlier this year, we hosted Berkshire's first ever **Padel Coaching Course**, with an impressive 45% of the candidates being female. Among them was Kristen Paskins-Burdett, the first female wheelchair padel player to start the LTA Padel Instructor.

Berkshire will be hosting the **Inclusive Padel Tour (IPT)**, the first UK, on 20 September 2025 at Padel Maidenhead. This event will spotlight wheelchair padel and aims to inspire more people with disabilities to take up Padel. Looking ahead to 2026, we are expecting several new venues to open their doors, making it even more accessible to adult and junior players of all levels, across the county. With more courts and coaching sessions, on the way, it is the perfect time for both newcomers and experienced players to get involved.

The Berkshire Tennis Novices Grand Prix 2025: Round-up

The Berkshire Novices Grand Prix returned in 2025 for its third year with 8U, 9U and 10U events run at venues across the county. This year we saw:

- 109 entries across six 8U events
- 87 entries across seven 9U events
- 57 entries across five 10U events

These events introduced inexperienced players to competition using a round robin format. We received positive feedback from parents and hope many players now feel confident entering Grade 5 events and progressing through the LTA competition pathway.









TEAMS & COMPETITIONS

Team Berkshire Triumphs at Over 35 County Cup

The Berkshire Over 35 County Cup women's team competed in Division 4b at Eastbourne this past weekend, putting in a strong performance that led to promotion.

The team arrived on Friday for a practice session on the grass courts to acclimate to the surface and finalize doubles pairings. Their first match on Saturday was a decisive 5-0 victory against Cambridgeshire. Singles players Laura Godfrey and Claire Powell performed exceptionally well, supported by successful doubles pairings of Sara Jenkins and Sarah Baker, and Gill Galloway and Ilona Hawker.

On day two, the team faced Derbyshire. Despite challenging, breezy conditions and rain delays, the team secured a 4-1 win. This set up a crucial final day match against Bucks, who had also won their previous two matches.

The final day brought even worse weather with stormy winds and rain. The match format was shortened to ensure it could be completed. Berkshire rose to the occasion, with Laura and Claire again winning their singles matches to secure the overall victory.

The team finished first in their group, earning a well-deserved promotion to Group 3 for next year. The team's success was supported by a dedicated group of Berkshire supporters who braved the difficult weather in Eastbourne.
